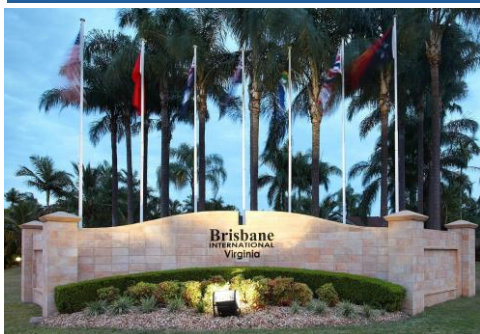

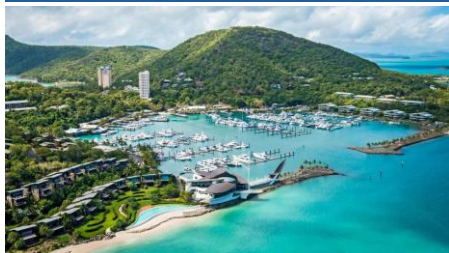
Day 3 (BD) ROCKHAMPTON TO DAYDREAM ISLAND**Saturday 03 July 2027**

After breakfast make our way to the small town of **Sarina** for an early lunch followed by a tour of the **Sarina Sugar Shed**. Located at the foothills of the Connors Range, the Sarina Shire is a relatively un-spoilt area which has retained much of its natural charm while developing into a thriving business area. Learn about the region's thriving sugar industry and watch how sugar is extracted from the cane. With some time to purchase some sweets to take with us we now reboard the coach and head to the Port of Airlie to catch the island transfer with Cruise Whitsundays which takes us to our next destination - **Daydream Island**. It's a small island in the Whitsundays and known for its beautiful resort, natural beauty, activities in the Great Barrier Reef and for its very own Living Reef, a large coral lagoon with over 100 species of fish, 80

species of coral, and various invertebrates. The resort features an underwater observatory as part of its Living Reef, that allows us to view marine life without getting wet. The observatory has a large window and is situated below the water's surface, offering a unique view of the fish, coral, and other invertebrates within the reef. Upon arrival we disembark the vessel and the friendly hotel staff welcomes us to the island. Following check-in, we settle in for the next two nights and relax before we meet over dinner.

This morning, we board the historic **Kuranda Scenic Railway**. Track through picturesque valleys and century old tunnels of the magnificent **Barron Falls National Park**. Perched above Cairns, we find the mountain village of **Kuranda**. The quaint village is full of vibrant arts and crafts shops where we have time to wander and purchase lunch. Embark on a breathtaking experience with **Skyrail Rainforest Cableway**. Gain a truly unique perspective while gliding metres above the pristine jungle canopy. Immerse yourself in the

sights, sounds, smells and tranquillity of one of the world's most botanically fascinating areas that has remained relatively unchanged for 130 million years. We stop off during our ride to visit a The Edge Lookout, visit the Rainforest Interpretation Centre and enjoy a short walk along a boardwalk through the rainforest. Tonight, our dinner will be at **Dundee's on the Waterfront** ideally located on Cairns Marina with views of the Trinity Inlet and surrounding mountainside.

Day 8 (BLD) GREAT BARRIER REEF

A highlight of your tour is today's visit to the Agincourt Reef Pontoon located on the **Outer** Great Barrier Reef. Quicksilver's **Wavepiercer** catamaran will take you to a reef at the very edge of Australia's Continental Shelf, to an underwater world that is a

dazzling kaleidoscope of colour and brilliance. Here you can choose to snorkel or stay dry and explore the reef from the comfort of the semi-submarine, just one metre underwater. Watch the fish feeding from the unique underwater viewing platform and underwater observatory or fly in a helicopter over the reef (diving and helicopter flights are optional and at own expense). You will be given a talk by a Marine Biologist, to answer all your questions and enjoy morning and afternoon tea and smorgasbord lunch. Return to your hotel in the late afternoon with dinner at leisure.

Friday 09 July 2027

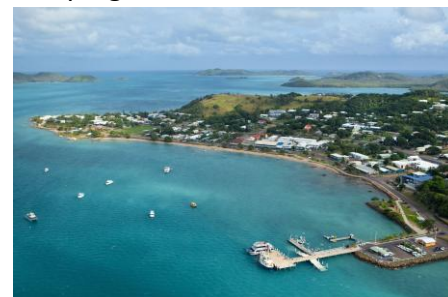

Day 10 (BLD) CAPE YORK

Saturday 10 July 2027



Today promises to be one of the most memorable highlights of our Cape York adventure as we journey to **Pajinka—the northernmost point of mainland Australia**. After making our way through the rugged tropical landscape, we take the walk to the famous sign and experience the thrill of standing at the very top of the country. Take time to soak up the spectacular coastal views, capture plenty of photographs and celebrate

reaching this iconic Australian landmark. Subject to road conditions, we then continue to historic Somerset, once home to the legendary Jardine family and the site of a government outpost established in 1864. Here, we discover stories of early settlement and gain an insight



into the remote history of Cape York. Lunch is enjoyed in the beautiful surrounds of palm-fringed Anchorage Beach, overlooking the waters of Albany Passage. After lunch, take a leisurely stroll along the beach, breathe in the fresh sea air and appreciate the peaceful tropical setting before we return to our accommodation after an unforgettable day.

Day 10 (BLD) CAPE YORK

Saturday 10 July 2027

FITNESS LEVEL: MODERATE: A moderate level of fitness and good mobility are required for today's activities. The walk to the Tip of Australia involves approximately 1.5 kilometres over uneven, rocky and sometimes sloping terrain, so passengers should be able to walk confidently without assistance and manage natural surfaces, steps and exposed conditions. Comfortable, enclosed walking shoes are essential, and passengers should carry water, wear sun protection and take care underfoot. The visit to Somerset and walk along Anchorage Beach are more leisurely, although the ground may still be sandy or uneven.

Day 11 (BLD) CAPE YORK TO BRAMWELL STATION

Sunday 11 July 2027

Southward bound, we cross the mighty Jardine River, stopping at Fruit Bat Falls for lunch. Relax, swim and enjoy this unique area with its enchanting waterfall. Travelling

along part of the Old Telegraph Track, before we make our way to a former 'true blue' Aussie cattle station, Bramwell Station – ensuite facilities. This property has 12 ensuite rooms only, once they are booked, basic donga style rooms with shared facilities will be allocated.

Day 12 (BD) BRAMWELL STATION TO WEIPA

Monday 12 July 2027

After breakfast, we begin our journey south through the remote wilderness of Cape York, travelling across a fascinating mix of tropical bushland, open savannah and rugged outback scenery. Along the way, we cross the Wenlock River and enjoy the ever-changing landscapes that make this part of Queensland so unique. We then continue towards the western shores of the Cape and the Gulf of Carpentaria,



arriving in Weipa later in the day. This afternoon, there may be an opportunity to join an optional Wildlife Eco River Cruise at your own expense, offering the chance to discover the region's waterways, birdlife and natural beauty from a different perspective. Tonight, we settle into our accommodation at The Albatross Resort, where all rooms feature ensuite facilities.

Day 13 (BLD) WEIPA TO MUSGRAVE

Tuesday 13 July 2027

After breakfast, we continue our journey south through the remote landscapes of Cape York, enjoying another day of changing scenery from the comfort of our touring vehicle. Along the way, we stop at the picturesque Archer River, a peaceful setting surrounded by bushland and a welcome place to stretch the legs, take in the natural surroundings and enjoy a break from the road. We then travel on to Coen, a historic township established during the region's gold rush era. Here, we gain a glimpse into Cape York's pioneering past and the



stories of the prospectors, settlers and travellers who once passed through this isolated part of the Peninsula. This afternoon, we arrive at the historic Old Musgrave Telegraph Station, once an important link in the communication network connecting Cape York with the rest of Australia. We settle into our overnight accommodation, with ensuite facilities, and enjoy the unique atmosphere of this remote outback property before gathering for the evening.

Wednesday 14 July 2027

After an early start, we head east towards Princess Charlotte Bay where we explore Lakefield National Park (**road conditions permitted**), a haven for the many birds and animals native to this area. Lagoons, billabongs, and wide river lakes are home to both fresh and saltwater crocodiles. Travelling on to the old gold port of Cooktown, where we visit Captain Cooks Landing, before settling into our accommodation in Cooktown - ensuite facilities.

The final exciting day has, unfortunately, arrived, but before returning to Cairns, we make our way south passing the mysterious Black Mountain and the historic Lion's Den Hotel. Traversing the jungle shrouded Bloomfield Track (**road conditions permitted**) we see where the 'rainforest meets the reef' at Cape Tribulation. We travel through the splendors of a World

Heritage listed rainforest. A scenic drive along the Marlin Coast back to Cairns is a perfect way to complete your tour. (Subject to road being accessible). Arriving late afternoon in Cairns our Heritage 4WD Safari Tour comes to an end with a drop off to our accommodation.

Day 17 (BLD): CAIRNS TO ATHERTON TABLELANDS

Saturday 17 July 2027



This morning, we make our way through the region known as the **Atherton Tablelands**. The region is a rather unique place in Australia and what makes it so special is the combination of its geographic location in the Tropics (between 400 and 1100 metres), its pleasant climate and the volcanic activities which have shaped large parts of its landscape. One of the most dramatic examples of this is **Lake Barrine**

– a beautiful volcanic crater lake. It's here we enjoy **relaxing cruise** on the lake before lunch in the **Lake Tearooms**. Next, we visit the remarkable **Curtain Fig Tree**, with its curtain of aerial roots that drop 15 metres to the ground. Large basalt boulders cover the forest floor which is probably why the forest here wasn't cleared for farming – and why the tree remains standing. Continuing to **Gallo Dairyland**, we hear about the cheese making process and sample some of the yummy products overlooking the dairy farm. After an interesting day we arrive in **Mareeba** for our overnight accommodation. Dinner tonight will be **at Mareeba Leagues Club**.

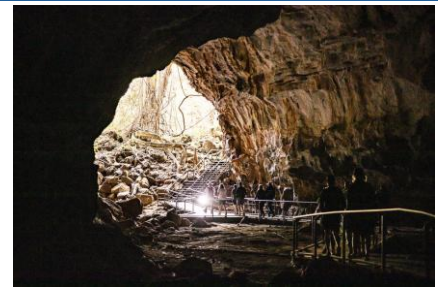

Following dinner this evening, we are in for a special treat as we discover **Forsayth by Night** in the company of a knowledgeable local guide. Through lively storytelling, humour and engaging tales, we are introduced to the colourful characters, remarkable events and fascinating history of a bygone era. This interactive experience brings the town's past to life through the finest traditions of Australian bush storytelling and promises to be a memorable way to conclude our day.

Sunsets are renowned in this area and tonight we will see why.

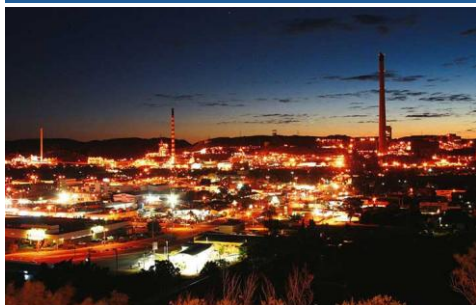

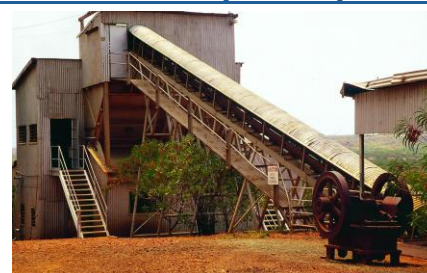
Day 25 (BLD) BARKLY HOMESTEAD TO TENNANT CREEK

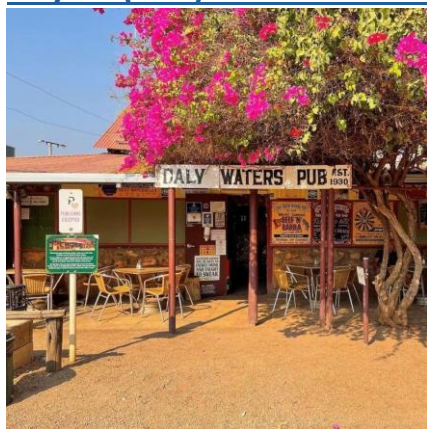

Day 26 (BLD): TENNANT CREEK TO MATARANKA

Monday 26 July 2027



An early start this morning allows us to make the most of our time in beautiful **Mataranka**. After breakfast, we continue north through the vast landscapes of the Northern Territory, travelling via Renner Springs and Elliott as the scenery gradually changes from open cattle country to greener tropical vegetation. Around midday, we arrive at the legendary **Daly Waters Pub** for lunch. Steeped in history and overflowing with outback character, this iconic watering hole became a popular meeting place for air personnel serving in the Pacific during World War II. Today, its walls are covered with fascinating memorabilia, creating a lively and memorable atmosphere for our lunch stop. This afternoon, we

continue to **Mataranka**, a lush oasis renowned for its crystal-clear thermal springs. Being in one of Australia's premier wine-producing areas, lunch today is a special occasion at **Aravina Estate**. Set in the northern reaches of the Margaret River wine



region, near Dunsborough, this beautiful estate is surrounded by sweeping vineyards, rolling hills, natural bushland and manicured gardens. We enjoy time to take in the peaceful setting and savour lunch at one of the region's highly regarded wine estates. Our touring continues with a visit to the **Vasse Virgin Olive Oil and Soap**

Factory, where we discover a wonderful range of natural olive oil-based skincare products, soaps and gifts. We then tempt the tastebuds at the **Margaret River Chocolate Factory**, with time to browse the delicious selection of handcrafted chocolates and sweet treats before concluding a delightful day of caves, cuisine and regional flavours.

This really is a stunning part of coast, particularly the appropriately named **Great Ocean View** – a section of cliff stop roadway with some remarkable views of the Great Australian Bight and Waterloo Bay, we enjoy lunch in the area before making our way to **Port Lincoln**, located on one of the world's largest

protected natural harbours. **Boston Bay** stretches from the tip of the Port Lincoln National Park to Point Boston and covers an area more than 3½ times the size of Sydney Harbour. **Port Lincoln** was discovered by Matthew Flinders, under his commission by the British Admiralty to chart Australia's unexplored coastline. He arrived in **Boston Bay** in February 1802 and named the spot **Port Lincoln** after his native Lincolnshire in England. This afternoon we arrive in Port Lincoln and check into our accommodation before dinner.

Port Lincoln is located on one of the world's largest protected natural harbours. Boston Bay stretches from the tip of the Port Lincoln National Park to Point Boston and covers an area more than three times the size of Sydney Harbour! We have a local guide join the coach for tour of the area which includes the statute of the mighty **Makybe Diva** - the only horse ever to win three Melbourne Cups! Farewelling our guide, we make our way to **The Fresh Fish Place**, Port Lincoln's leading multi-species fish

processing factory. See how local fish are filleted and packaged for sale. We may get the chance to see experienced staff opening oysters or scallops (in season) and learn how to fillet the famous King George Whiting. After our tour, we get to sample a variety of tantalising products, followed by lunch here. This afternoon we will pay a visit to the **Constantia Designer Craftsmen** – a truly unique attraction. Testimony to this firm's level of craftsmanship is the unprecedented honours bestowed by the International Guild of Master Craftsmen, Constantia being one of



only six firms in the world to be made a fully accredited member. Constantia was commissioned to design and build the Table to the House of Representatives and the Hansard Table, the main tables for the new Parliament House in Canberra. Finishing our day off we spend time at the **Boston Bay Winery** for a wine tasting. There aren't many wineries in the world with a more spectacular setting. Set on a hill above the shores of Boston Bay, the winery enjoys good soil, a gentle climate, and cooling breezes from the Southern Ocean.

centre houses jewellery made from Broken Hill silver, a Broken Hill mineral display and an extensive range of original paintings by well-known artists. However, it is the dramatic **"Big Picture"** painted by Peter Anderson that will be a highlight of our tour to Broken Hill. Late morning, we drive to **Silverton**, which preceded Broken Hill and was for a time, the largest town in the Barrier Ranges. Today it's a virtual ghost town but a



few of the historic buildings remain. We enjoy a light lunch at the **Silverton Pub**, then step back in time at the **Silverton Gaol and Historical Museum**. Virtually every aspect of life in Silverton's heyday is represented, with literally thousands of items on display. On the outskirts of town is the **Mundi Mundi Lookout** and from here we can see the wide-open expanses of the Mundi Mundi Plains as well as the curvature of the earth.

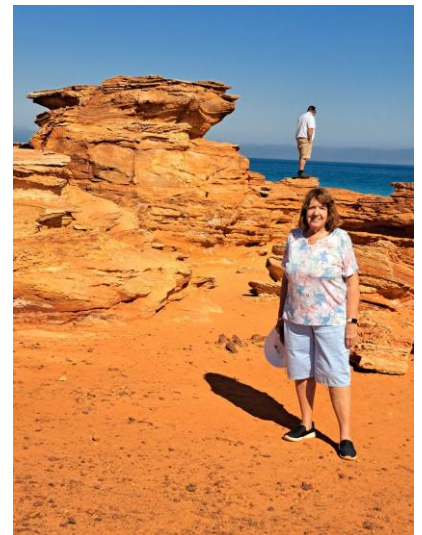
