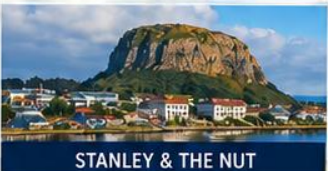

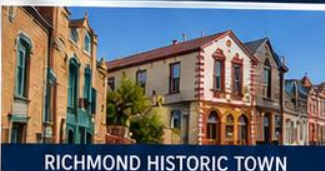

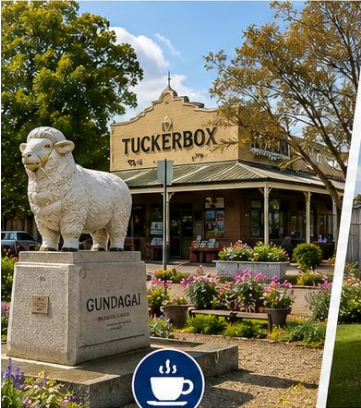

Lunch today is enjoyed in a picture-perfect waterfront setting at the **Geelong Boat House**, where we can relax and take in lovely views across the bay. With its classic seaside atmosphere and beautiful location, it is the perfect place to pause and enjoy a meal before continuing our sightseeing.

This afternoon we delve into the fascinating history of one of Australia's great wool cities with a visit to the **National Wool Museum**. Housed in a beautifully restored historic wool store, the museum shares the stories of Geelong's wool industry and the important role it played in shaping the city's growth and identity. Through engaging displays, historic machinery, textiles, craftsmanship and personal stories, we gain a deeper understanding of the people, skills and industries that helped build Geelong's past.

Later in the day, the excitement truly begins to build as we make our way to the Spirit of Tasmania terminal. Here we board our overnight voyage across Bass Strait, ready for a memorable sea journey to Tasmania. Welcome to Tasmania! This morning we arrive in Devonport aboard the Spirit of Tasmania, with beautiful early morning views over the Mersey River and Tasmania's picturesque north-west coastline welcoming us to the Apple Isle. After disembarking, we make our way to the Argosy Motor Inn to enjoy a hearty breakfast before beginning our first full day of Tasmanian discovery.

Our journey then takes us through the scenic north-west countryside to the colourful township of Sheffield, famously known as the **"Town of Murals."** Nestled beneath the spectacular backdrop of Mount Roland, Sheffield is one of Tasmania's most unique and artistic country towns. Its streets have been transformed into a wonderful open-air gallery, with more than 140 murals decorating buildings, walls and laneways, each sharing stories of the town's pioneering past, rural life, local characters and heritage. From here, we continue through beautiful farming country to the charming riverside town of Deloraine, set on the banks of the Meander River. With its leafy streets, historic buildings, boutique stores, galleries and relaxed country charm, Deloraine is one of Tasmania's most picturesque heritage towns. There will be time here to purchase lunch and perhaps enjoy a short stroll through the town centre or along the river before our afternoon experience.

We then visit Yarns: Artwork in Silk, where we enjoy a fascinating light and sound presentation showcasing beautifully detailed silk artworks. These remarkable, hand-crafted panels bring Tasmania's history, landscapes and stories to life, highlighting the skill and patience behind each piece.

This afternoon we continue to the historic village of Westbury to visit **Pearn's Steam World**, an incredible collection of restored steam engines, vintage tractors, agricultural machinery and historic equipment. This impressive display offers a wonderful insight into Tasmania's farming, transport and mechanical history, celebrating the ingenuity and hard work of earlier generations.

Later today, we make our way to Launceston, Tasmania's second oldest city and a beautiful destination filled with heritage streetscapes, parks, gardens and riverside scenery. After checking into our accommodation, there will be time to settle in and relax before we come together to enjoy dinner and reflect on our first wonderful day exploring Tasmania.

Today we uncover the beauty and history of northern Tasmania from both land and water. Joining Tamar River Cruises aboard the *Tamar Odyssey*, we set off to explore the picturesque Tamar River and the spectacular Cataract Gorge. Relax as we glide past Tamar Island wetlands, charming riverside communities, historic homes and rolling vineyards while listening to the captain's fascinating commentary about the region's history, wildlife and early settlement. Keep an eye out for seabirds and local wildlife as we enjoy morning tea onboard surrounded by Tasmania's peaceful natural beauty. Back on dry land we head to the iconic James Boag's Brewery, proudly brewing in Launceston since 1881.

Here we enjoy a delicious, shared platter lunch before taking a guided tour through the historic brewery, learning about the brewing process, the pure Tasmanian water that makes Boag's famous, and of course sampling some of their crisp beverages.

This afternoon we visit beautiful City Park, one of Launceston's most treasured public spaces, renowned for its magnificent old trees, colourful seasonal gardens, heritage features and Japanese macaque monkeys.

We then continue to the magnificent Cataract Gorge Reserve — a stunning natural wonder located just minutes from the city centre. Surrounded by towering cliffs, lush bushland and beautifully landscaped gardens, the Gorge is one of Tasmania's most unique attractions. Explore the walking paths and suspension bridge or perhaps take a ride on the world's longest single-span chairlift (own expense) for breathtaking views over the South Esk River and gorge below.

After another wonderful day discovering Tasmania's natural beauty and local flavours, we return to our hotel for dinner this evening.

Today we enjoy the crisp clean air and wide-open spaces of Tasmania's beautiful north-east as we make our way from Launceston towards the coast. Our first stop is the magnificent **Bridestowe Estate Lavender Farm**, the world's largest privately owned lavender farm and one of Tasmania's most iconic attractions. Set against a backdrop of rolling hills and endless rows of lavender, Bridestowe is a feast for the senses, with fragrant fields, pretty rural views and a wonderful story behind its famous purple blooms.

During our visit, we experience the farm in action with a fascinating tour of the flower shed and distillery. Here we learn about the harvesting process, how the lavender oil is extracted, and the care that goes into creating Bridestowe's much-loved lavender products. There will also be time to sample a selection of delicious lavender-inspired treats and browse the extensive gift shop, filled with culinary delights, fragrant body products, gifts and unique souvenirs.

From here, we venture to the small village of **Legerwood** to admire its remarkable memorial tree carvings. These beautifully carved trees are a moving tribute to local soldiers who lost their lives during World War I, with each carving telling a personal story of service, sacrifice and remembrance. It is a peaceful and meaningful stop that brings local history to life in a very special way.

We then continue to **The Pub in the Paddock**, one of Tasmania's oldest and most character-filled country pubs. Full of rustic charm and country hospitality, this unique lunch stop offers a true taste of rural Tasmania and plenty of local personality.

After lunch, we continue through Tasmania's scenic north-east, taking in the ever-changing countryside, forests, farmland and coastal landscapes as we make our way towards **Scamander**. On arrival, there will be time to relax, settle in and reflect on another wonderful day of discovery, history and Tasmanian charm.

This morning we leave the coast behind and travel inland through Tasmania's ever-changing countryside to **Campbell Town**, a historic town set on the banks of the Elizabeth River. Once an important staging post for travellers and horse-drawn coaches journeying between Hobart and Launceston, Campbell Town still holds plenty of old-world charm and colonial character.

From here, we continue to the beautifully preserved village of Ross, one of Tasmania's most picturesque historic towns. While here, we visit the **Tasmanian Wool Centre**, where we uncover the fascinating stories of Tasmania's wool industry, tracing its history back to the colony's earliest exports. The centre showcases the importance of wool in shaping the region's farming heritage, along with displays on local history, craftsmanship and life in the Midlands.

Continuing our day, we veer off the beaten track and make our way to Bothwell, a charming village rich in colonial heritage and surrounded by rolling rural landscapes. Here we visit the **Australasian Golf Museum**, a unique attraction that tells the story of how golf evolved from a simple game played by villagers in Scotland into the international sport enjoyed around the world today. With fascinating displays, memorabilia and stories from golfing history, it is a surprising and enjoyable stop in the heart of Tasmania.

Our sightseeing drive then continues through the scenic countryside towards the historic town of Richmond, one of Tasmania's most loved heritage villages. We stop to view and photograph the famous **Richmond Bridge**, Australia's oldest bridge still in use. Built by convict labour in the 1820s, this beautiful sandstone bridge is one of Tasmania's most iconic historic landmarks and a wonderful reminder of the state's convict past.

After a day filled with history, heritage and beautiful country scenery, we continue on to **Hobart**, Tasmania's charming capital city, where we check in to our hotel and settle in for the evening.

This morning we set off on a guided sightseeing tour of **Hobart**, a city where history, harbour views and old-world charm come together beautifully. Everywhere we go, the past seems to step out to meet us, from the early colonial streetscapes to the grand sandstone buildings and waterfront warehouses that tell the story of Tasmania's capital.

Our tour takes us through **Sullivans Cove**, the birthplace of Hobart and still the lively heart of the city's working waterfront. Once a busy port for sailors, merchants and early settlers, the area is now filled with restaurants, historic buildings, fishing boats, pleasure craft and wonderful harbour views. We also discover the quaint cottages and narrow streets of **Battery Point**, one of Hobart's most charming historic neighbourhoods, where beautifully preserved homes and architecture whisper stories of a bygone era. Thanking our local guide, we conclude our morning tour at the **Mawson's Huts Replica Museum**, a fascinating tribute to Australia's Antarctic history and the remarkable expedition led by Sir Douglas Mawson. Here we have time to explore the museum and learn more about the harsh conditions, courage and determination of the early Antarctic explorers.

From here, we make our way back to Hobart's vibrant waterfront, where there will be time to purchase lunch and soak up the festival atmosphere. The remainder of the afternoon is yours to enjoy at the **Australian Wooden Boat Festival**, with plenty of time to wander through the various displays, admire the beautiful timber vessels, watch demonstrations, enjoy local food and entertainment, and experience the buzz of this wonderful harbour celebration.

After a day filled with history, maritime heritage and Hobart's lively waterfront charm, we return to our hotel for another relaxing evening.

Today we experience one of Tasmania's most significant and moving historic sites with a visit to the **Port Arthur Historic Site**. Set in a striking location surrounded by gardens, stone ruins and peaceful harbour views, Port Arthur is a place of great beauty, yet also a powerful reminder of the harsh conditions endured by some of Australia's earliest European inhabitants.

Our visit begins at the **Visitor Interpretive Centre**, where we are taken on a fascinating journey into the life of a convict. Through engaging displays and stories, we retrace the path from a petty crime in Britain, to transportation across the world, and finally to life within the penal settlement at Port Arthur. It is a thought-provoking introduction to the people, hardships and history that shaped this remarkable place. With time for lunch, we then join a guided tour through the historic penal settlement. As we walk among the old buildings, ruins and landscaped grounds, we learn more about the daily lives of the convicts, soldiers, officers and families who once lived here. From punishment and reform to industry and survival, the stories of Port Arthur offer a deeper understanding of Tasmania's convict past.

After our guided tour, there will be time to explore the settlement at your own pace. You may choose to wander through the gardens, visit the restored buildings, take in the harbour views or spend more time absorbing the atmosphere of this UNESCO World Heritage-listed site. We also enjoy a cruise around the harbour, passing the **Isle of the Dead**, the final resting place for many who lived and died at Port Arthur. Leaving the historic site, we begin our journey back towards Hobart, pausing along the way to admire some of the dramatic natural attractions of the **Tasman Peninsula**. We stop to view the impressive **Tasman Arch** and **Devils Kitchen**, where the power of the Southern Ocean has carved rugged cliffs, deep chasms and spectacular coastal formations over thousands of years.

After a memorable day of history, reflection and breathtaking scenery, we return to Hobart for the evening.

With a slightly earlier departure this morning, we leave Hobart behind and begin our journey towards Tasmania's wild and rugged west coast. Sit back and enjoy the changing scenery as we travel through valleys, riverside landscapes and peaceful country towns, gradually making our way into some of the island's most dramatic wilderness regions.

Our first stop today is the historic **Salmon Ponds**, the oldest trout hatchery in the Southern Hemisphere. Set within beautiful English-style gardens dotted with ponds, bridges and mature trees, it is a peaceful place to wander and enjoy the surrounds. During our visit, we discover the fascinating history of trout fishing in Tasmania at the **Museum of Trout Fishing** and the **Angling Hall of Fame**, before enjoying morning tea in this lovely setting.

Continuing through the Central Highlands, we arrive at **Derwent Bridge** to visit the remarkable **Wall in the Wilderness**. This impressive hand-carved timber artwork tells the story of the region's people, history and landscapes, depicting the hardship, strength and perseverance of those who lived and worked in Tasmania's remote high country.

We then enjoy lunch at the **Wilderness Hotel**, a welcoming stop surrounded by the quiet beauty of the highlands. After lunch, our journey continues through the pristine wilderness of the **Franklin-Gordon Wild Rivers National Park**, part of the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area, known for its ancient forests, rugged mountains, deep valleys and wild rivers.

As the landscape becomes more dramatic, we make the climb into **Queenstown**, a fascinating mining town with a distinctive character and striking surrounding hills. From here, we continue on to the harbourside village of **Strahan**, nestled on the edge of Macquarie Harbour.

On arrival, we check in and settle into our accommodation, where we will enjoy the next two nights in this beautiful and atmospheric part of Tasmania.

We are in for a truly stunning day as we join our **World Heritage Cruise**, one of Tasmania's most memorable west coast experiences. Departing from Strahan, we cruise across the vast waters of **Macquarie Harbour**, surrounded by remote wilderness, dramatic scenery and stories from Tasmania's fascinating past.

Our journey takes us into the beautiful **Gordon River**, where the reflections of ancient rainforest, still waters and towering trees create an unforgettable scene. This area is home to the remarkable **Huon Pine**, one of the world's oldest living tree species, along with dense temperate rainforest that forms part of the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area. During our Heritage Walk, we have the opportunity to step ashore and experience this ancient environment up close, wandering beneath the canopy and learning more about the unique plants, trees and ecology of the region.

We also visit historic **Sarah Island**, once one of the harshest penal settlements in Australia. As we explore the island, we uncover stories of convicts, shipbuilding, isolation and survival, while viewing the remains of buildings including the old jail house. It is a powerful reminder of the hardship endured in this remote and unforgiving landscape.

Another highlight of the cruise is seeing **Hells Gates**, the narrow and dramatic entrance to Macquarie Harbour. This notorious passage, named by early convicts and sailors, was once the only way in and out of the harbour and remains an impressive sight as the harbour meets the wild Southern Ocean. With breathtaking scenery, rich history, ancient rainforest and a beautiful buffet lunch included onboard, today is sure to be one of the standout experiences of our Tasmanian adventure.

As the train winds into the wilderness, we follow the course of the **King River** towards **Teepookana**, once the fourth busiest port in Tasmania and the place where construction of this remarkable railway first began. Along the way, we are surrounded by dense forest, river views and the rich natural beauty that makes this region so special.

Throughout the journey, we'll hear fascinating stories of the railway, its engineering challenges and the resilient people who lived and worked along its length. From the miners and railway workers to the communities that relied on this vital link, the railway brings to life an important chapter of Tasmania's west coast history. With morning tea included, it is a wonderful and relaxed way to experience this pristine wilderness.

On our return to Strahan, the afternoon is yours to enjoy at leisure. You may choose to wander the waterfront, browse the local shops and galleries, visit the visitor centre, enjoy the peaceful harbour views or simply relax and soak up the charm of this remote west coast village.

Tonight, before dinner, we enjoy the much-loved performance "**The Ship That Never Was.**" This highly entertaining live show brings history to life with humour, audience participation and storytelling as we learn the incredible true story of Sarah Island convicts and their daring escape. It is the perfect way to end another memorable day in Strahan.

We have a sensational day planned as we explore more of Tasmania's spectacular north-west coast. Our day begins with a visit to the historic township of **Stanley**, one of Tasmania's most picturesque seaside villages, beautifully set beneath the dramatic backdrop of **The Nut** and surrounded by sweeping views across Bass Strait.

Perched high on a promontory overlooking the town is the remarkable **Highfield Historic Site**. This elegant homestead is a stunning example of colonial architecture and was built for Edward Curr, the chief agent of the Van Diemen's Land Company. During our self-guided tour, we step back into the early settlement days of the region, exploring the grand rooms, outbuildings, gardens and stories connected to this important historic property.

We then take a drive around the charming township of Stanley, with time for a morning break and a closer look at **The Nut**, the imposing landmass that dominates the town. This ancient volcanic plug rises sharply from the coastline and is one of the most recognisable natural landmarks in Tasmania's north-west. Lunch today is enjoyed at the welcoming **Stanley Hotel**, where we sit down to a homely meal in a classic country setting. After lunch, we farewell Stanley, pausing at a local lookout to take in more of the beautiful coastal scenery before continuing our journey.

This afternoon we make our way to **Table Cape**, another impressive natural landmark formed from an extinct volcanic vent. Here, dramatic cliffs drop away to Bass Strait, creating a spectacular vantage point over the coastline and surrounding farmland. We enjoy a short stroll along the walking track, taking time to breathe in the fresh coastal air and admire the sweeping ocean views.

After a wonderful day filled with history, heritage villages, volcanic landscapes and breathtaking coastal scenery, we return to **Burnie** for the evening.

Classified as a living plant museum, this impressive garden is home to an extraordinary collection of rhododendrons and companion plants from around the world. As we wander through the grounds, we can enjoy the winding pathways, tranquil lakes, bridges, forested sections and colourful seasonal displays, all carefully designed to showcase plants from different regions and climates.

Continuing along Tasmania's scenic north-west coast, we travel via the charming seaside town of **Penguin**, known for its coastal views, quirky penguin-themed features and relaxed village atmosphere, before making our way towards Devonport.

Here we visit the **Don River Railway Museum**, where Tasmania's railway heritage comes to life. All aboard as we travel along the historic Melrose line, taking in views of the township of Don and areas of local historical significance. This enjoyable heritage rail experience offers a glimpse into the important role railways once played in connecting communities, industries and coastal towns across the region. After purchasing lunch, we continue to the **Australian Axeman's Hall of Fame**, a national museum celebrating Australia's wood-chopping history, timber heritage and sporting champions.
